Specifically designed for **secondary educators** who teach about the Holocaust, this 2½ day professional development forum will feature experts, researchers, and authors who will explore the content, correct methodologies, and rationales for teaching the history of the Holocaust. The purpose of the forum will be to increase teacher knowledge of the Holocaust and to examine contemporary issues associated with this history.

On Friday there will be a live video conference with the Institute of Education at the University of London and the United States Holocaust Memorial Museum in Washington, DC. In addition, participants attending at Region 10 will be provided both breakfast and lunch, as well as many printed materials and books for use in the classroom.
