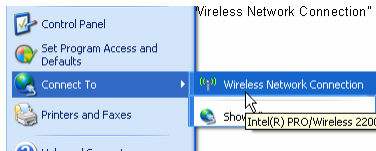


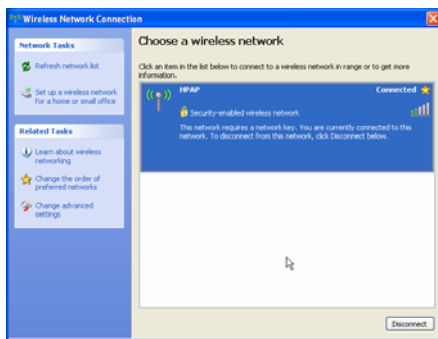
Wireless Access – Spring Valley Technology Center Conference Rooms

The main objective of the wireless network is to provide Internet access to our clients attending meetings/workshops in the Spring Valley Technology and Conference Center*. The wireless network is not intended to be a replacement for the wired infrastructure. Because some Internet services can have a negative impact on network performance, presenters needing to perform any high-bandwidth usage tasks (downloading files, file sharing, video streaming) must use the wired network. Lab reservations are still recommended for group computer activities.

1. Many laptops have a physical switch located on the computer that turns wireless networking on and off. Please make sure this is set in the on position



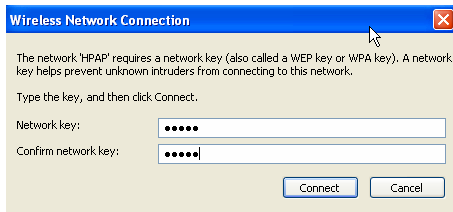
2. Go to the Start Menu, select “Connect to”, then choose “Wireless Network Connection”



3. Select “HPAP” and click the Connect button. If you don't see “HPAP”?

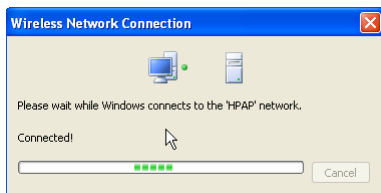
Click the “Refresh Network list” link in the upper left corner.

Reminder: When connecting to any wireless network, you should assume that other people will be able to see anything you send over the network, such as passwords, files, and e-mails, and you should use it with caution.



4. In order to limit usage of our wireless network to our clients, the Tech Center network is secured.

Enter network key: “esc10”
Confirm network key: “esc10”
Click “Connect”



5. Wait while Windows connects to the wireless network.



6. Close the “Choose a Wireless Network” box. The wireless network icon in the system tray will display a pop-up message indicating your connection.
