Ideas for Use of Funds

- Respite care for students with high intensity needs. This could include summer day camps or sleep over camps.
- Attendant care to offer in-home skills training; provide time for routine normalization with families.
- Family counseling services that would support the family in developing a more cohesively functioning family unit. This could include behavior plans and management of such, parenting skills training, establishing procedures and routines for family needs and activities.
- Case worker to provide services that would teach a child to manage leisure time or develop skills to entertain him/herself (sports, hobbies, develop personal talents and interests) and also develop a healthy self esteem. This could include summer camp expenses.
- Case worker to provide activities that would teach socialization skills (activities in the community, interaction with peers, hidden registry of procedures and routines) and work with families to continue the development of skills. This could be designed in a peer support group setting to serve several children at one time. This could also include summer camp expenses.
- Case worker to provide in-home family support in developing procedures and routines that would lead to a more productive, healthier functioning family unit. This can include parenting skills training activities.
- Family Dynamics Training seminars to help the family set goals and expectations and strategies for achieving these. This could include home behavior management plan development.
- Parent Support Group seminars to help families find support in each other and provide parenting skills training.
