On **PAGE ONE**, *Teachers, please be sure to indicate your email address so we can confirm registration and any necessary additional information.*

Place a check mark **✓** beside the events the student wishes to enter. Those events with different levels **must also have a level indicated (X)**. The prerequisite skills sheets on the website will help you determine the most appropriate level for the student.

The Notetaker category may include any electronic notetaking device including, but not limited to, Braille Lite, BrailleNote, PacMate.

\*REMINDER: When completing the Computer Access event, the student's access mode **must** be indicated.

On **PAGE TWO**, under the Test Material Media section please provide information regarding font size, Braille, or auditory media (tape). Unless otherwise indicated, all Braille tests and materials are provided in uncontracted Braille. Also, please address any special accommodations and student T-shirt size.

Finally, on **PAGE THREE**, parental permission **IS REQUIRED** for the student to participate in the event. By giving permission to participate they are granting permission to allow media exposure. The third page also includes Lunch Reservations for guests and teachers.
