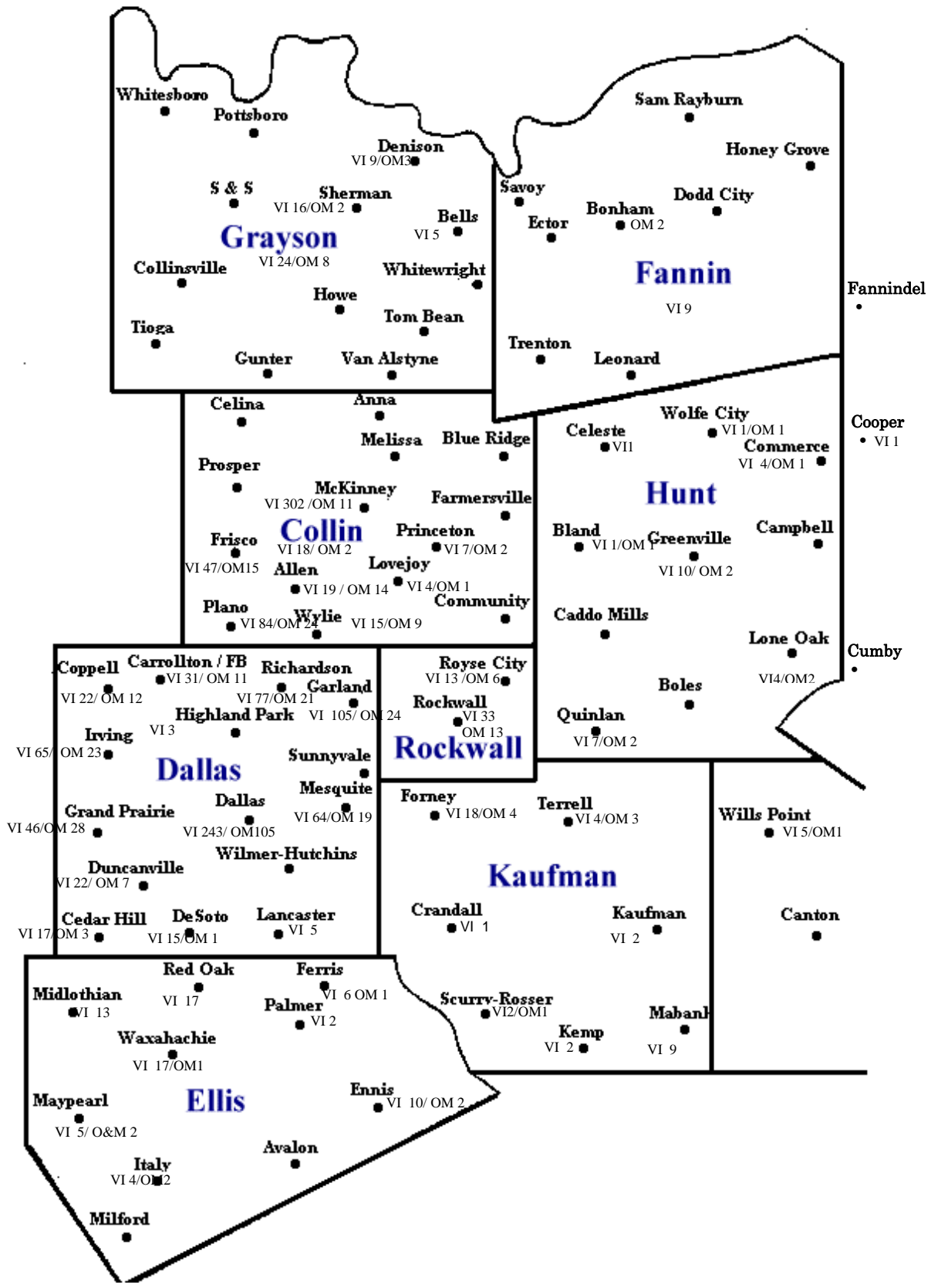

Regional Plan for Serving Students with Visual Impairments Within Region 10 Effective September 1, 2009

Services that are the responsibility of the Local ISD or SSA:

1. Low Vision Evaluations, which are recommended by the ARD committee. Low vision devices prescribed by the exam as needed for educational purposes.
2. V.I. materials, not considered capital outlay equipment or software, that are necessary for teaching visually impaired students.
3. Onsite visits to TSBVI as needed and student transportation to TSBVI.
4. Supplemental Braille Transcription Services (Use local resources or contract with outside resources such as Visual Aid Volunteers, Inc.).
5. Direct and Consultative Services provided by a certified teacher of the visually impaired and/or orientation and mobility specialist Service Options:
 - 1) ISD V.I. Teacher
 - 2) SSA V.I. Teacher
 - 3) Districts without full-time need may secure V.I. services through Region 10 by notification of intent to contract no later than **February 15th.**

State Supplementary, Discretionary and ESC Local Funds for V.I. will be used to provide the following:

1. Allocation of funds to district/SSA VI/O&M programs which employ a Certified Teacher of the Visually Impaired (CTVI). This allocation is based on the number of VI students registered with the state in January. Each district/SSA will receive a per student allocation for each student registered. These funds may be used at the discretion of the district/SSA to support their VI/O&M program and may include (but not limited to): Braille transcription, compensatory skills training, conference attendance, evaluation and reference materials, low vision evaluations, summer enrichment programs/services, supplies and materials for CTVI and COMS personnel, VI student materials/equipment and CTVI/COMS salaries. According to state guidelines, these funds cannot be used for: indirect costs, speech therapy, occupational therapy, counseling, food, and registration fees for Recording for the Blind and APH materials that are available from the state.
2. Support ESC V.I. staff serving the visually impaired (i.e. housing, phone, etc.)
3. V.I. technical assistance to all districts in the region
4. Distance Learning V.I. certification classes in coordination with Region IV Education Service Center and Stephen F. Austin State University
5. V.I. specific professional development
6. Purchase V.I. Specific software
7. Purchase V.I. Capital Outlay
8. Expanded Core Curriculum
 - a. Technology Olympics

- b. Five students' tuition for Space Camp. Utilize other resources for airfare.
- c. Sports Extravaganza
- d. Other events planned by the Expanded Core Curriculum Committee

To Measure Student Performance:

RSPI was used to evaluate Regional Student Performance of Students with Visual Impairments during the spring of 2008. Aggregated data will be disseminated in the spring of 2009. V.I. teachers and O&M Instructors will develop and address regional improvement strategies until spring of 2011 when students' performance will be reassessed.
