Brooke Brock was a general education teacher for 11 years in Canton ISD, 4 years in third grade and 7 years in first grade. She served as a special education teacher for two years when she was nominated for the Region 10 PrEP Educational Diagnostician Program by the Van Zandt County Cooperative for Special Education Services.

She started her journey as a diagnostician in January of 2011. Brooke remarks, “The Region 10 Program helped me assimilate the knowledge I had from my master’s program in administration with my special education teaching experience for the skills I needed as a diagnostician. I loved the fact that Region 10 provides many different types of presenters from a variety of settings so participants are exposed to a many styles and backgrounds. The schedule of the program allowed me to continue my teaching while completing the coursework through online classes and convenient summer and evening schedules for required classes held at Region 10. Brooke worked for two years as a diagnostician serving Canton ISD as a part of the Van Zandt County Cooperative. In May of 2014, she was named as Director of Special Education in Athens ISD, and continues in that position today.
