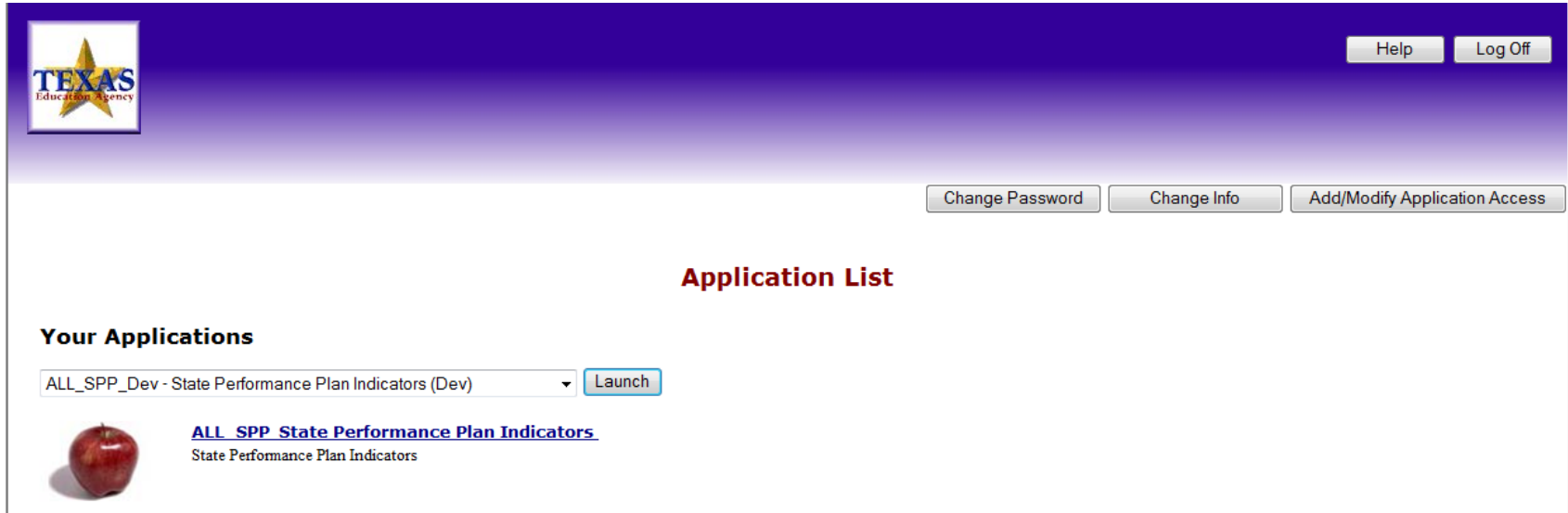

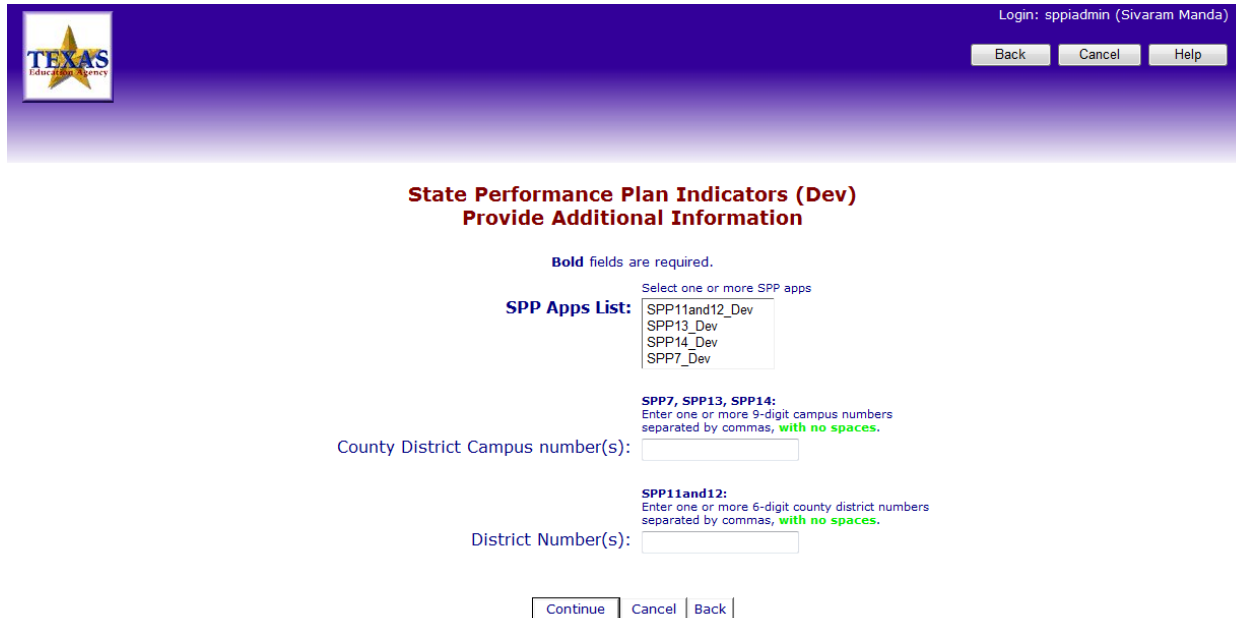

All of the SPP indicators are now accessed from the main SPP application page. Combining the indicators allows you to stay in the SPP application without having to log out and log back in when switching between SPP indicators. Additionally, reports can be run for different indicators from the main SPP application page. Each report is generated in a new browser window, to allow you to compare information between the indicators.

Indicator 7 identifies the percent of preschool children (3,4, and 5 years old) with IEP's (Individualized Education Programs) who demonstrate improvement in:

- Positive social-emotional skills (including social relationships)
