Laptop Level 2 SKILLS / Practice Test

Students MUST bring their own laptop.

Students will use a poem with an approximate 3rd Grade Reading Level to:

- Type a multi-stanza poem which has various stanzas out of order.
- Create a second page in the file and copy the poem to Page 2
- Make several editing changes on the second copy:
 - Cut and paste blocks of text
 - o Change font style
 - o Change font size
 - o Use Find and Replace in MSWord
 - o Bold text

Using the poem on the following page, do the following

- 1. Create a file named "Cold".
- 2. Type the name of the test on the first line of your document.
- 3. Type your student number on the next line.
- 4. Use the poem on the following page to do the following:
 - a. Center and underline the title "Bad Cold".
 - b. Center the words "by Shel Silverstein" on the next line.
 - c. Return to the left margin, copy and paste the poem.
 - d. Proofread for spelling errors.
- 5. Create a new page in your file. On the new page, make the following changes:
 - a. Copy material from your first page to the second page.
 - b. Change the font to Arial.
 - c. Type the words "Page 2" as the third line of your heading.
 - d. Move the second stanza (paragraph) to make it your first stanza or paragraph. (It begins with the lines "This cold is too much for my coatsleeve."
 - e. Replace the word "hand" to "dish"
 - f. Replace the word "coatsleeve" to "shirtsleeve"
 - g. Replace "curtains" with "drapes"
- 6. Spellcheck your file. (Ignore words like Atchoo)
- 10. Save your file.
- 11. Print the file.
- 12. Turn in both pages of your file.
