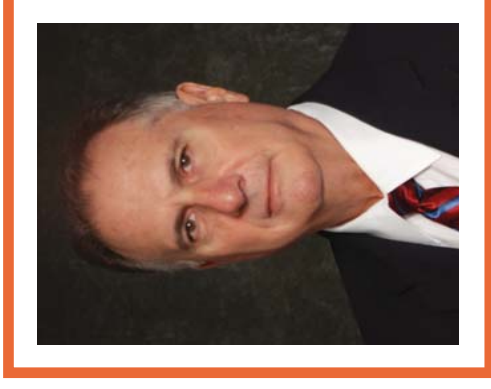


From the Executive Director

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Administration

The primary function of general administration is to provide overall leadership for the planning, management, and operation of the Center. In order to accomplish these purposes effectively and efficiently, the organizational structure of the Region 10 ESC is comprised of four divisions and one office, as follows:

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Division of Administration (Administrative Services)

This division has responsibilities for four major components, including: (1) administrative training and support services; (2) business/finance, facilities and operations services; (3) human resources services; and (4) retirement asset management services. This division offers services both external in support of schools and internal to the ESC. The Associate Director, Administration is Gordon Taylor, gordon.taylor@region10.org.

Division of Financial Services (Business Office)

This division has responsibility for two functions, including: (1) Region 10 ESC Business Office operations and (2) print shop services. This division offers business services internal to the ESC and offers printing services both internally and in support of local districts. The Chief Financial Officer is Sue Hayes, sue.hayes@region10.org.

Division of Instruction (Instructional Services)

This division has responsibility for a wide array of instructional support services to schools, including: (1) instructional media/technology and telecommunications (EdNet¹⁰) services; (2) curriculum, instruction and staff development services; (3) special populations, assessment and teacher preparation services; and (4) early childhood education and Head Start services. The Deputy Executive Director, Instruction is Sandy Maddox, sandy.maddox@region10.org.

Division of Technology and Data Services (Computing Services)

This division has responsibility for four service areas, including: (1) mainframe computer services; (2) mini-micro computer services; (3) telecommunications technical support services; and (4) assistance in preparing, editing, and submitting PEIMS data. This division offers services both internal to the ESC and in support of districts and charter schools. The Interim Chief Information Officer is Ron Knight, ron.knight@region10.org.

Office of Communications

This office has the responsibility for various internal and external communications of the Center, including publications, client surveys, mass communications efforts, focus group processing and interagency relations. The office also has the oversight responsibility for the major planning efforts of the institution, including regional quality planning and monitoring, Strategic Planning, and the Regional Plan for Improvement. The Chief Communications Officer is Ron Simpson, ron.simpson@region10.org.

Performance-Based Monitoring (PBM) Services

This service is designed to provide training and assistance to district, campus, and special program personnel in preparing for and participating in the Performance-Based Monitoring review process. Training and technical assistance will be customized to fit the need of each individual district. Desk audits and visits, as needed, will be coordinated by TEA and include the following programs: bilingual education and ESL, career and technology education, NCLB, migrant, and special education. The focus of PBM is on federal programs compliance, while state compliance will be primarily monitored through self-assessment and desk audit processes.

An alternate five-year projection is also produced using the last three years' enrollment data. ALT-Part 1 provides school administrators with professional growth opportunities in leadership and management. Training sessions are designed to address the variety of administrative functions encountered by campus and district level leaders on a daily basis. Topics are selected based on input from administrators and current “hot-button” issues at the regional, state, or national level. While certain sessions are created to meet the needs of a target audience, all administrators in Region 10 independent school districts and charter schools are encouraged to participate regardless of administrative assignment.

ALT-Part 2 provides school districts the opportunity to host training specifically designed to meet the needs of their administrators. Division of Administration personnel will work with the district to design and deliver the desired training. *Walkthroughs for Instructional Focus* and *Using PDAS to Support Rigorous Classroom Instruction* are examples of customized training previously delivered.

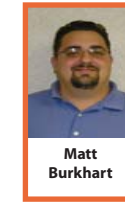

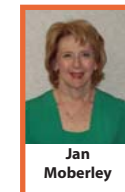

WebCCAT is an online item bank, test creation, and assessment system with the ability to create student assessments in the areas of language arts, math, science, and social studies. WebCCAT includes more than 40,000 questions mapped to the TEKS in item banks for grades 3-11. The banks also contain Spanish items for grades 3-5 in language arts and math, and grade 5 science. The current WebCCAT revision includes over 3000 new items aligned to STAAR Readiness and Supporting standards. In addition new resource arrays are linked for major concepts for all courses.

Income guidelines established by the federal government are lower than the eligibility for free and reduced lunch. Enrollment opportunities are supplied for children with disabilities. The district must agree to comply with the federal Head Start Performance Standards.

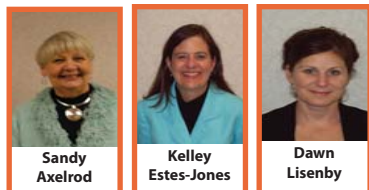
